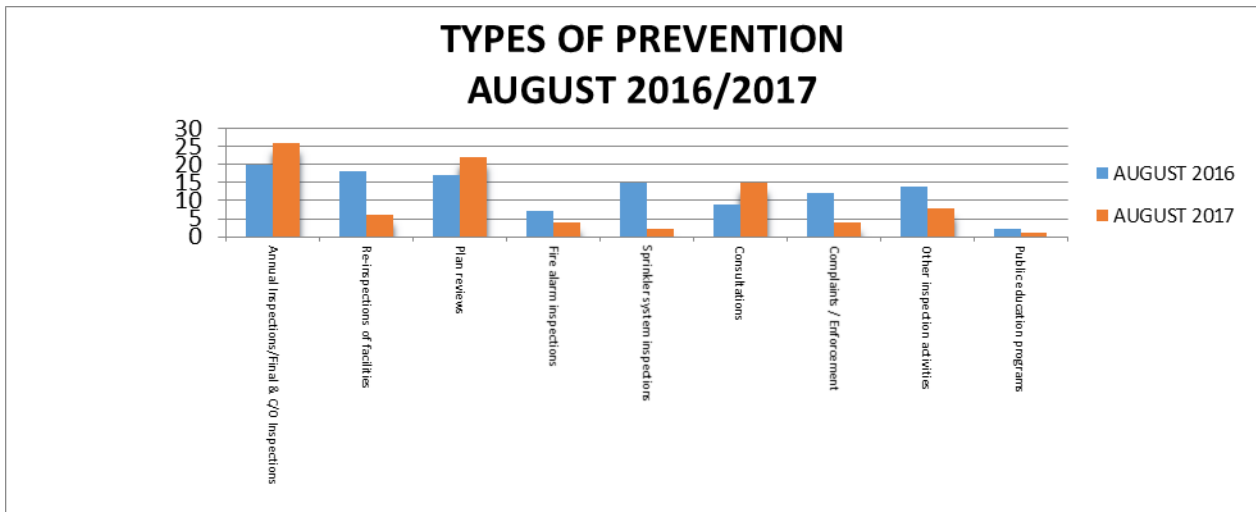


FIRE PREVENTION DEPARTMENT UPDATE

WFD – Special Operations Report - August 2017

Dive Response:

1. The Webster Special Operations Unit received numerous requests in connection with Hurricane Harvey during August 2017. There were multiple water rescues handled by our department, and an estimated 200+ individuals were contacted during the storm.

Training:

1. Discussed multi-city dive training exercises.
2. Reviewed policy and procedures.
3. Four (4) new divers are scheduled to attend an advanced open water public safety dive (PSD) course. There is one component to be completed prior to PSD testing.
4. Four (4) new divers completed the first portion of the rescue diver course: WPD: A. Brooks; and WFD: SC D. Spencer, SC L. Thomas, and Lt. C. Johnson.
5. Discussed specifications for proposed dive boat. The specifications have been reviewed and submitted to Fire Chief P. Shipp for his approval.
6. Discussed the purchase of additional dive gear to outfit new team members.
7. Discussed scheduling rescue dive skills for completion during September 2017.

Meeting:

1. AFM W. Chappell and other team members met to discuss strategy in moving forward with training and equipment needs.

Car Seats:

1. The Webster Fire Department CPS technicians assisted with three (3) car-seat installations during August 2017. Car-seat installations are handled as needed at the fire station, and through participation at special events held at the fire station and outside venues.
