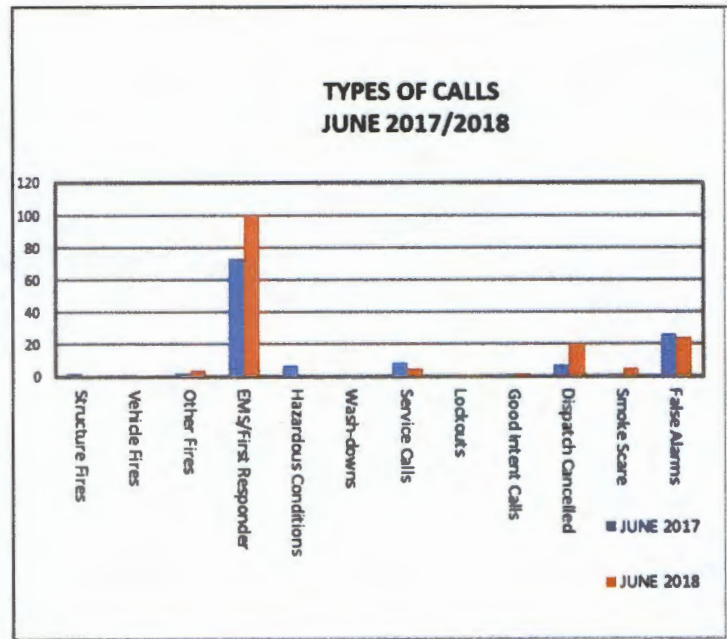

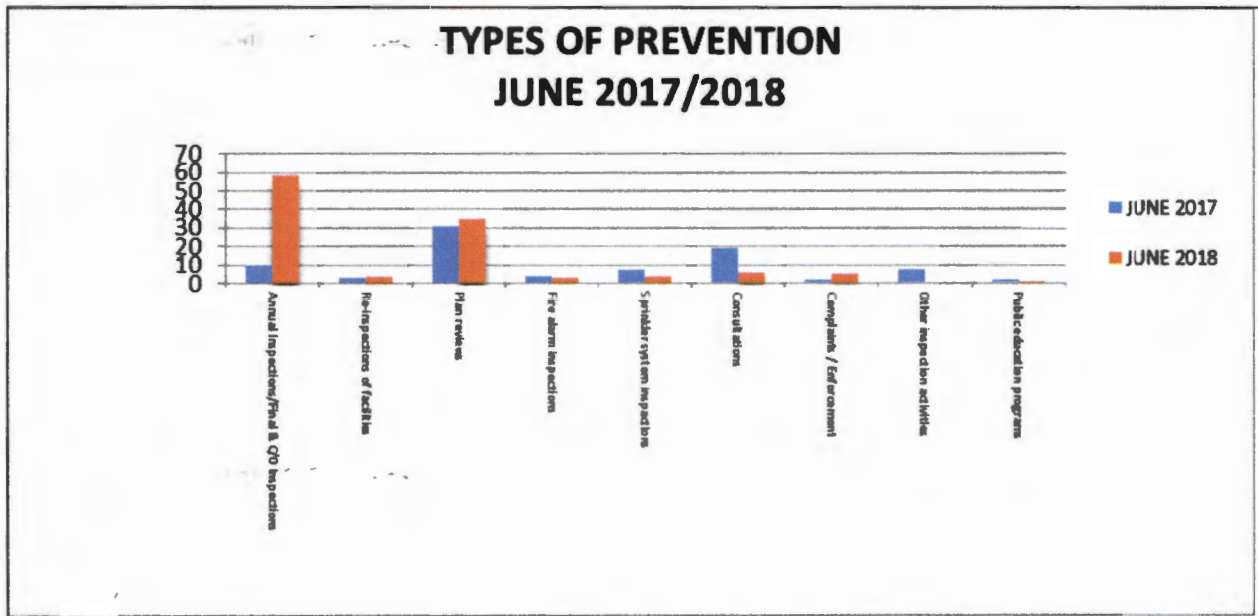


FIRE PREVENTION DEPARTMENT UPDATE

WFD – Special Operations Report - June 2018

Dive Team: Report submitted by Assistant Fire Marshal W. Chappell

Dive Response:

1. Webster Special Operations Unit received no requests for response during June 2018.

Dive Training:

1. June 14, 2018, from 08:00 hrs. to 13:00 hrs.: Full face mask and dry suit training for D. Spencer, C. Johnson, and A. Brooks. Part 1 of 2 open water dives for specialized gear certification through PADI with instruction by Texas Dive Center.
2. June 25, 2018, from 08:00 hrs. to 13:00 hrs.: Full face mask and dry suit training for D. Spencer, C. Johnson, and A. Brooks. Part 2 of 2 open water dives for specialized gear certification through PADI with instruction by Texas Dive Center. These two (2) certifications are complete, and the three (3) divers are now certified by PADI in these two (2) disciplines.
3. Roster reduction from 8 to 7 divers with the departure of Shift Commander Les Thomas.
4. Upcoming training:
 - D. Spencer to complete PSD on July 26, 2018; and
 - Texas Dive Center to provide dive-tender training to current roster and other WFD members interested in performing that function.

Rescue Boat: Report submitted by Assistant Fire Marshal W. Chappell

Rescue Boat Response:

1. No emergency responses during June 2018.

Rescue Boat Training:

1. June 28 – June 29, 2018, from 08:00 hrs. to 17:00 hrs.: Four (4) WFD members attended Flood Rescue Boat Operator class with Rescue Boat-14 in the Clear Lake and Taylor Lake bodies of water. Instructed by Rescue Training International and coordinated by Harris County, this 2-day, hands-on training course provided 3-year certification for the following members:

This is a new training program developed in the wake of Hurricane Harvey with multiple agencies in the area participating in the skills surrounding rescue boat operation during floods.

1. The WFD CPS technicians assisted with six (6) car-seat installations during June 2018. Car-seat installations are handled as needed at the fire station, and through participation at special events held at the fire station and outside venues.

Training: No trainings were completed during June 2018. All personnel and equipment are ready for future deployments, if requested.

Deployment:

On June 6, 2018, Chief Shipp deployed to the Scenic Loop Fire Complex in Fort Davis, Texas, as Strike Team Leader for TIFMAS. Once the fires were contained, Chief Shipp and his strike team demobilized and returned June 12, 2018.
