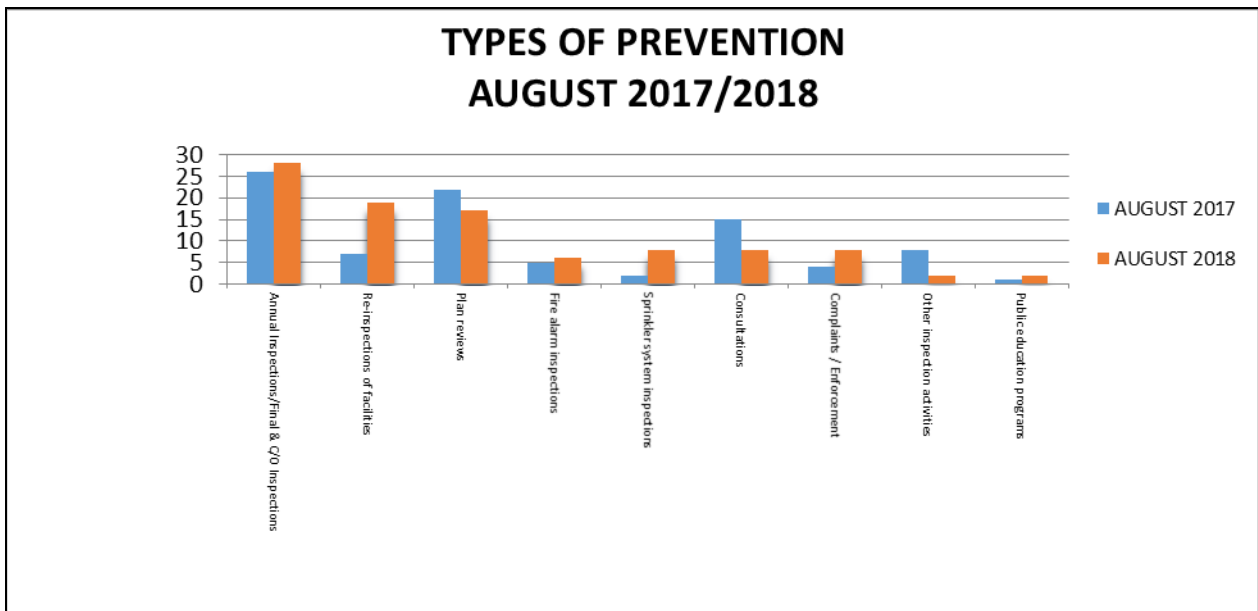


FIRE PREVENTION DEPARTMENT UPDATE

WFD – Special Operations Report - August 2018

Dive Team: Report submitted by Assistant Fire Marshal W. Chappell

Dive Response:

1. Webster Special Operations Unit received no requests for response during August 2018.

Dive Training:

1. August 3, 2018, from 08:00 to 11:00 hrs.: Trailer re-organization, cleaning and dive gear inspection.
2. New equipment components incorporated into new and existing gear (new hoses and seals).
3. Upcoming training:
 - Coordinating instruction for PADI Tender certification training (surface support) to current roster and other WFD/WPD members interested in performing that particular function. This training will likely occur during October 2018.
 - Continued re-organization of the dive trailer. Planning for new storage racks and general layout of the trailer to increase readiness and efficiency for deployment.

Rescue Boat: Report submitted by Assistant Fire Marshal W. Chappell

Rescue Boat Response:

1. No rescue boat responses during August 2018.

Rescue Boat Training:

1. No rescue boat training conducted during August 2018. Rescue Boat 14 has been outfitted with a cover for additional protection during storage. Boat is in service and ready to respond.

Meeting:

1. No formal meetings were conducted during August 2018, only informal discussions concerning status and readiness.



Car Seats: Report submitted by S. Ricicar

1. The WFD CPS technicians assisted with five (5) car-seat installations during August 2018. Car-seat installations are handled as needed at the fire station, and through participation at special events held at the fire station and outside venues.

Wildland: Report submitted by Shift Commander J. Myers

Wildland Training:

1. Three (3) WFD members are enrolled in the S130/190 online course, and four (4) WFD members are enrolled in the S290 online course.

Deployment:

1. A state request for deployment to California. Two (2) WFD firefighters-paramedics and one (1) Type-6 engine joined approximately ninety (90) Texas firefighters and thirty (30) vehicles. TIFMAS assets were assigned to the Carr Fire located outside Redding, California for a 14-day deployment. All Texas assets have returned from deployment, and are back in service.
